



CPCCLS2001A Licence to erect and dismantle scaffolding basic level

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Participants must provide 100 points of identification and be 18 years of age or over and deemed Competent to be signed off for their National High Risk Work Licence. Maths is a major part of the theory component and a sound understanding is essential to be able to complete this training. You must have the ability to use and understand basic English and be able to work at heights. Appropriate clothing and boots is required to be worn at each session.

PURPOSE:

Our five day training course is for people who have minimal or no basic scaffolding experience. It's an intensive, hands-on training course, with the majority of the time spent scaffolding. A strong theoretical component also focuses on safe operating procedures.

WHAT SKILLS WILL I GAIN?

You will gain the skills to ensure you safely erect, alter and dismantle scaffold and also include:

- Calculating loads
- Component defects
- Erection and dismantle skills
- Estimating equipment
- Fall protection
- Fibre ropes, splicing, bends & hitches
- Hazards and planning
- Industrial safety nets
- Inspection of equipment
- Scaffold construction
- Scaffold inspection

ASSESSMENT

Mandated national assessment tools are used and include Theory, Calculations and Practical Assessments



WHAT QUALIFICATION WILL I RECEIVE?

On successful completion of the course you will be awarded Statement of Attainment for CPCCLSF2001A Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding basic level. As part of the Australian Skills Quality Authority this program is nationally recognised.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Experienced Persons

- If you have at least 50 hours experience as a basic scaffolder and do not have a high risk work licence, (Evidence must be provided in the form of a log book) or
- Have undertaken basic scaffolding training but did not get your high risk work licence

We have a program especially designed to recognise your prior learning (RPL) and thus allowing you to undertake the course over two days.

What are the options for performing high risk work?

There are only two options. All persons performing high risk work must either:

1. hold (or applied for) a licence in accordance with the regulations of the jurisdiction where they work, or
2. be engaged in formal training with a Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

A licence is required for any person performing work with high risk equipment or plant. The licence is valid in every Australian state and territory, enabling the holder to operate or work with high risk equipment under consistent standards anywhere in Australia.

A training manual is provided to assist applicants throughout the training/assessment. This is used, together with instructions from the trainer to ensure that each applicant has a thorough understanding of the material demonstrated.

Specific resources required for performance assessment at your site

- Facilities of sufficient size to enable each candidate to erect the required scaffold in addition to providing an appropriate space for a fixed or rolling cantilevered crane loadin platform and a mast climbing platform.
- Site and task specific hazard control measures
- A range of scaffolding components including equipment which complies with the requirements of the state legislation
- Sufficient scaffold components, including ladders, handrails, toe boards, mid rails, sole plates, transoms, ledgers, braces, spurs and screens to construct and dismantle a medium duty tube and coupler scaffold to the following standard
 - A three bay, three lift scaffold
 - Bays 1 and 2 are 3x2 metre lifts
 - Lift 3 to be a working platform to a height of 6metres
 - A medium duty cantilevered platform



- A sloping ramp constructed with steel scaffold tube to a height of 1 metre with a minimum width of 675mm
- A fixed or rolling cantilevered crane loading platform (CCLP) located at a minimum height of 4 metres. The CCLP must bear signs which state the maximum uniformly distributed load and the maximum concentrated load.
- The CCLP manufacturers installation instructions
- A safe and suitable means, such as a crane, for slinging, lifting and positioning of the CCLP including appropriately licenced personnel
- A mast climbing platform not exceeding 4 metres in height
- Scaffold key, podger hammer, torpedo spirit level, retractable tape measure or folding rule, scaffold belt with frogs and holder

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Payment of Fees/Refunds: What if you Cancel/Transfer, What if we Cancel/Transfer?

Payment of Fees

Fees are required to be paid prior to the commencement of courses. A deposit of 50% of the course fee is payable on enrolment and the balance prior to commencement of the course.

Our Cancellation/Transfer

Whilst we always endeavor to run scheduled courses we reserve the right to cancel or defer a course. In the event of this occurring, all fees will be refunded or you may elect to transfer to a course at a later date.

Your Cancellation/Transfer

If you are unable to attend a course, you may elect to re-schedule for that course, but only within 14 days of the original course date. We will not permit more than two (2) such transfers before a fee equivalent to 50% of the course fee will be charged.

If you cancel more than seven days prior to the course you may have any monies paid refunded in full or you may elect to be transferred to an alternative course with a fee adjustment.

If you cancel less than seven days prior to the course you will be charged a 50% (course fee) cancellation fee.

Should you not attend training/assessment a 100% cancellation fee, or loss of deposit, will apply.

Refunds

An application for refund must be made in writing (see F003-Refund Request Form) and will be determined by the Training Manager, or his delegate. Such supporting evidence (e.g. Doctor's Certificate / hardship) as is deemed appropriate should be provided with the written request.

High Risk Licences 100 points of Identification

Please note if you do not have 100 points of Identification, you are unable to sit the licence assessment.

A person must provide a minimum of three original documents (not photocopies) - **EITHER** one document from category A plus two documents from category B **OR**

Two documents from Category A plus one document from Category B.

- Australian Birth Certificate (not an extract or commemorative certificate)
- Australian Citizenship Papers
- Australian Passport/ Visa Overseas Passport/Visa
- Department of Immigration & Multicultural Affairs issued travel documents, including a Visa
- Department of Immigration & Multicultural Affairs issued Certificate of Evidence of Residential Status
- Firearm Licence
- Australian Photo Driver Licence

Category B – Evidence of Use of Identity

- Medicare Card
- Plastic Bank or Credit Card, with signature
- Tertiary Student Identity Card
- Department of Veterans' Affairs / Centrelink Pensioner Concession card
- Births, Deaths & Marriages Change of Name Registration / Marriage Certificate (not a church or celebrant document) or Deed Poll.
- Security Guard/Crowd Controller Licence
- Government issued Personal Photo ID Card
