



CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Participants must provide 100 points of identification and be 18 years of age or over and deemed competent to be signed off for their National High Risk Work Licence. Maths is a major part of the theory component and a sound understanding is essential to be able to complete this training. You must have the ability to use and understand basic English and be physically capable of performing dogging activities. Appropriate clothing and boots is required to be worn at each session.

PURPOSE

Our four day training course is for people who have minimal or no dogging experience. It's an intensive, hands-on training course, with the majority of the time spent dogging. A strong theoretical component also focuses on safe operating procedures.

WHAT SKILLS WILL I GAIN?

This course is designed to give participants the necessary skills and knowledge to undertake Dogging work safely and competently. On completion, candidates will be able to complete the application of slinging techniques including the selection and inspection of lifting gear, and also covers the directing of the crane or hoist operators in the movement of the load, including when loads are out of sight of the crane driver.

Candidates will also gain a sound knowledge of applicable legislation and standards and risk management associated with related to Dogging operations.

ASSESSMENT

Mandated national assessment tools are used and include Theory, Calculations and Practical Assessments

WHAT QUALIFICATION WILL I RECEIVE?

On successful completion of the course you will be awarded Statement of Attainment for CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging. As part of the Australian Skills Quality Authority this program is nationally recognised.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Experienced Persons

- If you have at least 50 hours experience as a dogman and do not have a high risk work licence, (Evidence must be provided in the form of a log book) or
- Have undertaken dogging training but did not get your high risk work licence

We have a program especially designed to recognise your prior learning (RPL) and thus allowing you to undertake the course over two days.

What are the options for performing high risk work?

There are only two options. All persons performing high risk work must either;

1. hold (or applied for) a licence in accordance with the regulations of the jurisdiction where they work, or
2. be engaged in formal training with a Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

A licence is required for any person performing work with high risk equipment or plant. The licence is valid in every Australian state and territory, enabling the holder to operate or work with high risk equipment under consistent standards anywhere in Australia.

A training manual is provided to assist applicants throughout the training/assessment. This is used, together with instructions from the trainer to ensure that each applicant has a thorough understanding of the material demonstrated.

Specific resources required for performance assessment at your site

- A working zone for the dogging assessment, with site and task specific hazard control measures.
- A slewing mobile crane with a telescopic boom and a winch with the capability of lifting the required loads
- A licenced crane operator
- FSWR sling, Soft sling, Chain sling, Shackles, Crane sling shorteners, lifting slings and all must meet state legislation requirements.
- Two way radios and whistles
- Loose pipes – with stillage – (minimum approximately 200kg)
- Steel plate (25mm, 1.5 x 2m)
- Square load – defined lifting points, multiple leg sling lift (minimum weight 2 tonne)
- Round Load (minimum weight 500kg), to be reeved, not less than 5 metres long
- Uneven weighted load (minimum weight 2 tonne)
- Tagline rope
- Sufficient (not less than 10mm) natural or synthetic rope to complete the four knots, bends and hitches



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Payment of Fees/Refunds: What if you Cancel/Transfer, What if we Cancel/Transfer?

Payment of Fees

Fees are required to be paid prior to the commencement of courses. A deposit of 50% of the course fee is payable on enrolment and the balance prior to commencement of the course.

Our Cancellation/Transfer

Whilst we always endeavor to run scheduled courses we reserve the right to cancel or defer a course. In the event of this occurring, all fees will be refunded or you may elect to transfer to a course at a later date.

Your Cancellation/Transfer

If you are unable to attend a course, you may elect to re-schedule for that course, but only within 14 days of the original course date. We will not permit more than two (2) such transfers before a fee equivalent to 50% of the course fee will be charged.

If you cancel more than seven days prior to the course you may have any monies paid refunded in full or you may elect to be transferred to an alternative course with a fee adjustment.

If you cancel less than seven days prior to the course you will be charged a 50% (course fee) cancellation fee.

Should you not attend training/assessment a 100% cancellation fee, or loss of deposit, will apply.

Refunds

An application for refund must be made in writing (see F003-Refund Request Form) and will be determined by the Training Manager, or his delegate. Such supporting evidence (e.g. Doctor's Certificate / hardship) as is deemed appropriate should be provided with the written request.

High Risk Licences 100 points of Identification

Please note if you do not have 100 points of Identification, you are unable to sit the licence assessment.

A person must provide a minimum of three original documents (not photocopies) - **EITHER** one document from category A plus two documents from category B **OR**

Two documents from Category A plus one document from Category B.

- Australian Birth Certificate (not an extract or commemorative certificate)
- Australian Citizenship Papers
- Australian Passport/ Visa Overseas Passport/Visa
- Department of Immigration & Multicultural Affairs issued travel documents, including a Visa
- Department of Immigration & Multicultural Affairs issued Certificate of Evidence of Residential Status
- Firearm Licence
- Australian Photo Driver Licence

Category B – Evidence of Use of Identity

- Medicare Card
- Plastic Bank or Credit Card, with signature
- Tertiary Student Identity Card
- Department of Veterans' Affairs / Centrelink Pensioner Concession card
- Births, Deaths & Marriages Change of Name Registration / Marriage Certificate (not a church or celebrant document) or Deed Poll.
- Security Guard/Crowd Controller Licence
- Government issued Personal Photo ID Card
